Five references to contexts / questions will be given. All the questions must be answered. Each question carries 5 marks. Answers will be in 250 words 5x5=25

SECTION-B

Five questions will be given, three questions to be answered. Each question carries 10 marks. Answers should be about 500 words. **3x10=30**

SECTION-C

Four questions will be given, in which three questions should be answered. Each question carries 15 marks. Answers should be about 600 words 3x15=45

In the Paper-II and Paper III main only two questions to be answered and the remaining 15 marks has been allotted for the translation and General Essay respectively.
