PATTERN OF QUESTION PAPERS SEMESTERS I / II / III / IV GC AND GE

SECTION - A

Five references to contexts / questions will be given. All the questions must be answered. Each question carries 5 marks. Answers will be in 250 words **5x5=25**

SECTION-B

Five questions will be given, three questions to be answered. Each question carries 10 marks. Answers should be about 500 words. **3x10=30**

SECTION-C

Four questions will be given, in which three questions should be answered. Each question carries 15 marks. Answers should be about 600 words 3x15=45

In Paper-II, Paper-III and Paper-IV, General Essays, Translation, Print and Electronic Media and Grammar are compulsory in each paper respectively. In Section-C the fourth question will be pertaining to this and it is a compulsory question.
