MADRAS CHRISTIAN COLLEGE (Autonomous), CHENNAI – 600 059 INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (MCC-IQAC) MINUTES OF MEETING III and IV – APRIL 13, 2023

The Third and Fourth meeting of IQAC – Q3 and Q4 (December 2022 to April 2023) for the Academic Year 2022-2023 was conducted on April 13, 2023 in online mode via Zoom (5.00 pm to 6.00 pm)

- 1. The meeting started with an opening prayer by Dr Ashik J Bonofer, Associate Coordinator, IQAC
- 2. Business arising from the previous meeting was presented by Dr. C. Amirthavalli, Associate Coordinator, IQAC
 - a. AQARs from 2015-16 to 2018-19 were entered into the NAAC portal and submitted.
 - b. NIRF 2023 data consolidation was carried out and presented for review in the HODs meeting in January 2023.
 - c. AAA templates were finalized based on the suggestions and recommendations of Vice-Principals, Academic Deans, Dean R & D, Dean of Student Affairs, Dean of Women Students, Controller of Examinations and Representative Senior Heads of the Departments from Aided and Self-Financed Streams.
- 3. Presentation of IQAC during December 2022 April 2023
 - Dr C Amirthavalli and Dr Ashik J Bonofer, Associate Coordinators of IQAC, presented the activities of IQAC from December 2022 to April 2023.
 - a. The HODs meeting to review NIRF 2023 data was convened by Dr. P. Wilson, Principal & Secretary, on January 4 2023. Dr C. Amirthavalli and Dr. Ashik Bonofer, Associate Coordinators of IQAC, MCC, did the presentation. Five different parameters in NIRF and their corresponding weightages were presented initially. This was followed by the

presentation of data captured and projected scores for different metrics. The Heads of Departments (Aided & SFS) confirmed the data presented and projected scores.

Dr P. Wilson, Principal, remarked that the parameter Graduate Outcomes (Placement & Higher Education) carries 25% of total weightage, so it is crucial to capture students' placement and higher education data. He said that the College has taken the initiative to collect this information during Graduation Day registration. He also mentioned that the Departments need to cooperate to efficiently capture this data along with valid evidence like offer letters, admit cards, etc.

After the approval from the Heads of the Departments, NIRF 2023 data was submitted on January 19 2023.

- b. Dr. C. Amirthavalli, Associate Coordinator, IQAC, delivered a lecture on 'Content Led Pedagogy: Understanding the four-quadrant approach' as a part of 'Pedagogical Quicky' on January 30 2023.
- c. IQAC completed Data Capture for 2021-22 in the AISHE portal and submitted the same on February 15 2023.
- d. IQAC conducted a workshop for Department IQAC nodal officers on the Data capture of the AAA template on March 9 2023, in Martin Hall Auditorium. During this meeting, the criterion team members interacted with Department nodal officers and facilitated the capture of department data using the AAA template.
- e. IQAC attended the online workshop on Curriculum design and framework organized by the Institute of Academic Excellence from 17th to 18th March 2023.
- f. IQAC organized and conducted a discussion meeting on 'Measurement of Attainment of Outcomes' between Vice-Principals, Academic Deans, Dean R & D, Dean of Student Affairs, Dean of Women Students, Controller of Examinations and Dr. Mercy Pushpalatha, MCC Board Member. Dr. Mercy chaired the session and clarified the doubts about drafting course and programme-specific outcomes. The discussions facilitated the College to understand the LOCF model of curriculum. Action plans were initiated by the Academic Deans and Controller of Examinations to introduce the LOCF curriculum model from 2023-24.
- g. IQAC conducted a series of AAA template discussions and finalization meetings with
- h. An external Academic Audit was conducted on April 5 2023.

Thirty-five departments (Aided and SFS) were categorised into seven verticals according to the subjects as follows:

- I. Humanities and Social Sciences: Aided History, Economics, Political Science, Public Administration, Philosophy, Social Work; SFS: Psychology and Social Work
- II. Media and Communication: SFS Journalism, Communication and Visual Communication
- III. Languages: Aided Tamil, English, Languages; SFS English, Tamil and Languages
- IV. Pure Sciences: Aided Physics and Chemistry; SFS Physics and Chemistry
- V. Sciences: Aided Mathematics and Statistics; SFS Mathematics, Computer Applications and Computer Science
- VI. Commerce and Administration: Aided Commerce; SFS Commerce and Business Administration
- VII. Geography and Physical Education: SFS Geography, Tourism and Travel Management& Physical Education, Health Education and Sports

Dr. P. Wilson, Principal welcomed the experts and presented the highlights of the College. Later, twenty-five external experts audited the Departments based on the criteria provided by IQAC during the pre-lunch session. Post lunch, the experts prepared the consolidated reports and recorded their suggestions and recommendations.

- i. A review of the Academic Audit was conducted on April 12 2023, with Criterion team members. The criteria team members discussed the suggestions on metrics to be included or modified based on the revised Self-Study Report of NAAC. The final recommendations were presented to IQAC to be included in the unit and revised Department templates.
- 4. Interaction with External Members: The external members appreciated the efforts of IQAC in conducting an External Academic Audit and wished the team a good NIRF 2023 score. The members also expressed concerns about preparing for SSR and NAAC visits during 2024.
- 5. Any other matter: Since Dr Johanna Jhansi Rani, Coordinator, IQAC, was retiring in June 2023, the IQAC team thanked her for her sincere and dedicated efforts for IQAC during the difficult pandemic period and wished her a happy retired life.
- 6. Prof. R. Sridhar, Vice-Principal (Administration), extended his appreciation to the IQAC team and thanked all the members for their suggestions to improve IQAC activities.
- 7. The meeting ended with a closing prayer by Dr. Obed Jackson, Assistant Professor, Department of Geography, Tourism and Travel Management.
